“So They Say”

Helpful hints from some “ole’ timers”!

If you have any helpful hints let us know!! A hint from James Keesee (a young timer)! He had a calf bloat. A vet was not available so they decided to slaughter the calf due to James’ suspicion. The calf was full of twisted plastic bags. So if you happen to have land in an area where plastic bags might blow in – James suggests – “we all better pick them up”!!

The Safest Beef For Your Arteries and Heart

If you want to go whole hog on steak without making a pig of yourself – Belgian Blue is the best choice. Ounce for ounce, it contains less fat and cholesterol than skinless chicken breast. Blues were imported for the purpose of crossbreeding to other commercial animals to produce leaner cuts of meat. As a result of their “double muscling”, natural size and bulk, they are high in protein and remarkably low in fat.

Typical cuts of beef will have 25 to 35 percent fat. Blues average 3 percent or less (skinless chicken breast has about 4 percent fat); a seven-ounce double portion carries just six grams of fat. Cholesterol counts are rock-bottom, too. Regular beef contains around 80 milligrams per serving, while fish has 50 or more. Belgian Blue beef has only 20 mg of cholesterol per 3 ½ ounce serving. The cattle are also raised hormone and antibiotic-free.

Best of all, the flavor and tenderness are lauded as world-class. Because Belgian Blue cuts are so low in fat, they cook in one-third the time of ordinary meat.

Additionally, the fine fibered beef has high moisture content, so it’s easy to prepare in a skillet or over a charcoal grill. Serve it rare or medium-rare for optimum flavor.

How To Cook The Perfect Steak

You’ve selected your favorite cut of steak: now you have to cook it. Broiling or grilling is a great way to prepare the lean Belgian Blue Beef!

Here are a few tips from the big boys!

- Beef cooks more evenly and stays juicier if allowed to come to room temperature prior to cooking.
- Placing the refrigerated meat on a thick aluminum or copper pan or cookie sheet will help warm it up by conducting the cold away more swiftly, Cover lightly with plastic wrap, but do not make an airtight seal.
- Grill the meat hot. A good way to test the grill is with water. Sprinkle a few

drops on the surface; if it sizzles, you're set.

- Be sure to cook the meat at the correct temperature. This is often the difference between a good steak and an inedible slab of shoe leather. Too high a temperature can char the outside before the inside is done properly, or can overcook the whole thing.
- For best results, baste the steak with olive or canola oil; sear the steak over a high heat before cooking it over reduced heat. Searing seals the juices in and allows the meat to cook more evenly.
- To check the temperature of your barbecue or gas grill cautiously hold the palm of your hand about four inches above the grate. Count the number of seconds you can hold your hand in that position before the heat forces you to pull away. Four seconds means medium coals, five seconds indicates medium-low.
- Always use tongs to turn your steak: a fork will pierce the meat and allow the natural juices to escape.
- Take the steak off the grill just short of the desired doneness. A thick steak will continue to cook after it's been removed from the heat. **DON'T OVERCOOK IT.** You can always put it back on the grill, but you can't undo what's been done.
- Allow the meat to rest 10 minutes before carving so the juices can settle and be redistributed throughout the meat.
- Prepare your side dishes first. In most cases, your steak will be done in a few minutes, and you don't want it to get cold while you're waiting for your baked potato or steamed vegetable.
- Enjoy!!

Showing information Reminder

Here are policies set forth by the board when showing cattle. Please help us with these policies:

(1) The tie breaking method used for the Premier Bull, Cow, and Breeder will be as follows: A tie in any of the premier awards will be which breeder or animal in each of the respective categories have the most Grand Champions, then the most Reserve Grand

Champions, continuing to the most Division Champions' and then to the most First Places. Records will be maintained in the ABBB office.

(2) Any questions or challenges on the results of any ABBB sanctioned show will need to be addressed before the official completion of the show and will be resolved before the animals leave the show grounds.

(3) Clipping of show cattle will be a slick shearing against the hair growth for the fullbloods, purebreds, and high percentage within 30 days of the show. The halfblood cattle may be shown slick sheared or with hair in order to accommodate the FFA and 4H shows. To show with hair the halfblood should be groomed and/or blown with the hair growth and not against the hair growth.

(4) Please refrain from wearing anything in the show arena that advertises your farm or ranch.
